

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter contains conclusions and suggestions based on data findings and discussions in the previous chapter. Therefore, conclusions and suggestions can be formulated as follows:

A. Conclusion

The researcher concluded that from 40 slang tweet data from Tori's Twitter account, using the theory of Allan and Burridge (2006), five types of slang were found: fresh and creative, flippant, imitative, Acronym, and clipping. The slang imitative type is the type of abbreviation most commonly found in Tori's Twitter account tweets. Based on Schendl's theory, 121 data were found using different types of abbreviations, namely clipping word, blend, Acronym, initialism, and contraction. The abbreviation contraction type is the type of abbreviation most commonly found in Tori's Twitter account tweets. An analysis of the intended meanings of the use of K-pop abbreviations and slang in Tori's tweets reveals how important language is in shaping digital fan identities and building strong virtual communities. The evolution of language in this fandom reflects the complex and ever-changing dynamics of fan culture.
